# **Cancer Survivors Praise Catholic Health**

It's been eight years since Will Hutchins first met Dr. Bhoomi Mehrotra, Catholic Health's chair of cancer services. The retired actor, who appeared in films with Elvis Presley and Jack Nicholson, was shaving when he noticed a lump in his neck. Testing revealed a malignant tumor at the base of his tongue. Hutchins consulted with Dr. Mehrotra and soon began treatment at St. Francis Hospital & Heart Center®.

"From the first time I met him, I could see in his eyes that he truly cared," Hutchins said. "He takes the time to listen and has this marvelous aura about him. Throughout my treatment, he told me step-by-step what would be happening, so there would be no surprises."

Today Hutchins and his wife, Babs, are enjoying life on Long Island's North Shore. "God bless all the medical professionals for the work they have done over the past year during the pandemic. They should all get medals."

"I had the most incredible care," said Elizabeth Morales, a breast cancer survivor. The New Hyde Park resident was treated by physicians from the Catholic Health Cancer Institute at St. Francis Hospital. After her mammogram indicated tumors in both breasts, Morales was referred to surgeon Dr. Marie Hui-Mei Chen, at St. Francis Hospital & Heart Center®. Following surgery, she saw St. Francis hematologist/oncologist Dr. Rajasree Roy.

"She was amazing," said Morales. "Dr. Roy is not someone who just sits behind a desk and talks at you. She is kind and compassionate, and I still call her to this day to talk. Everyone in her office was so nice, and they did everything they could to help me. I was fortunate to have so many beautiful people there to care for me."

"I wish I hadn't waited so long," said Richard Koster about the prostate-specific antigen (PSA) exam that changed his life. "I knew my prostate was enlarged, but I put off facing the situation, hoping meds would get me through. When I finally got the PSA and the results showed a very high count, I knew it was time to act."

Koster turned to Dr. Christopher Atalla of the Catholic Health Cancer Institute at Good Samaritan Hospital, who confirmed he had prostate cancer. After reviewing all the options, the Ronkonkoma resident opted to have his prostate removed entirely. Dr. Atalla is an expert in robotic surgery and robotic prostatectomy. "It wasn't a painful recovery at all," recalled Koster. "All I took in the days after was over-the-counter acetaminophen."

The 71-year-old father and grandfather is now back to one of his favorite pastimes, freshwater fishing on Blydenburgh Lake. "I feel better than I have in years," he said. "I no longer need to make five trips to the bathroom each night, which means I'm getting a full night's sleep. That's given me back my energy and alertness. I'm living better than I have in years."




