

New research conducted at St. Francis Heart Center recently published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology (JACC) shows that patients with an advanced form of coronary artery disease (CAD) can benefit from an investigational treatment using sonic pressure waves to break up hardened blockages in the heart. The novel therapy is known as intravascular lithotripsy (IVL). Similar to the therapy used to break up kidney stones, IVL is currently being reviewed by the U.S. FDA for potential pre-market approval in the United States under a "breakthrough" designation.
